

Interfaith Community Sanctuary



an Historic Landmark

Originally built in 1890, this small frame church shares its birth year with the City of Ballard. Constructed as a German Congregational Church, it served as the house of worship for local German immigrant families for about ten years.

The Ballard School Board rented the building for a while as a schoolhouse, but it returned to its original intent as a church in 1904 when another German congregation acquired the property for the St. Paul's Evangelical Church.

At that time, extensive repairs were undertaken, including the removal and replacement of the original tall steeple, which had become unsafe.

Over the years, other congregations have been housed in this historic building, each moving on to larger quarters and turning it over to other newer congregations. The building was purchased by the New Age Christian Church in 1973.

In 1981, Landmark designation was approved by the City of Seattle for this structure.

Ordinance Number: 110352.

Today it is home to Interfaith Community Church (est. 1999), honoring all faith spiritual traditions.

The historic building is a fine example of the small 19th and early 20th century community churches of the region.

Sanctuary

Our Sanctuary has seating capacity for 100.

It is a perfect location for cozy, intimate weddings, ceremonies, recitals, concerts and speaking events.

Eight steps lead up to the main entrance on the north side of the building. There is a small vestibule through the main door. Swinging doors separate the vestibule from the Sanctuary.



The main floor is filled with 18 lightly cushioned



wooden pews. There are twelve tall windows on the east and west sides and two small windows on the north side.

There is a 'Living Room' grand piano and an elegant lectern on the raised dais. The altar is recessed in a small alcove. Nine oil lamps rest on a pedestal atop the altar cabinet. Many Holy Books and significant scripture of diverse faith and spiritual traditions are housed within the altar cabinet. A hand painted blue mandala hangs above the altar.



The acoustics are remarkable in this lovely sacred space.

No food or drink is permitted in our Sanctuary.

Rest rooms: One restroom is located on the upper floor. Two additional rest rooms are located in the downstairs Fellowship Hall.

Parking: the parking lot is accessed through the alley.



Healing Room

Our Healing Room is located in the center of the building on the upper floor. There is a separate entrance through the east garden. This room is suitable for small gatherings, meditation and prayer circles. We find that it is cozy with 25 people, pleasant with 20, warmly welcoming with 15. There are windows facing east to the garden and west to the parking lot.

No food is allowed. Only liquids in cups with a secure lid is allowed.

A Rest Room is conveniently located nearby.

Fellowship Hall

Our Fellowship Hall has capacity for 100, We find we can sit 60 people well, and 80 if some are standing, as if for a reception. There are windows on three sides. A light colored cork floor keeps the room bright.

There is a user friendly thermostat and heat vents that can be opened or closed as needed. We have eight round tables that seat 6-8 people and 4 long conference tables that seat 8-10.

Two Rest Rooms are conveniently located nearby.

Kitchen

Our kitchen is located on the lower level next to the Fellowship Hall. There is a folding door separating the kitchen from the FH and an open 'pass through' window.

We consider the kitchen a communal space and all building users have access to the kitchen.

Classes upstairs and downstairs may choose to coincide break times.

All are responsible for tidying up the kitchen following each use.

Rental Rates:

Sanctuary: \$200.00 per hour.*

Healing Room: \$50.00 per hour.*

Fellowship Hall: \$75.00 per hour.*

Deposit: A deposit equal to one hour is requested to reserve the room for your chosen date.

Refund: Your deposit will be refunded if space is returned to the condition found.

Cleaning: If cleaning is required following your use, it will be paid from your deposit. If cleaning required exceeds deposit amount you will be billed for additional cleaning costs.

Parking: Our parking lot is accessible through the alley off of 20th Ave NE. Additional parking is available on the street.
