

Interfaith Community Church



an Historic Landmark

Originally built in 1890, this small frame church shares its birth year with the City of Ballard. Constructed as a German Congregational Church, it served as the house of worship for local German immigrant families for about ten years.

The Ballard School Board rented the building for a while as a schoolhouse, but it returned to its original intent as a church in 1904 when another German congregation acquired the property for the St. Paul's Evangelical Church.

At that time, extensive repairs were undertaken, including the removal and replacement of the original tall steeple, which had become unsafe.

Over the years, other congregations have been housed in this historic building, each moving on to larger quarters and turning it over to other newer congregations. The building was purchased by the New Age Christian Church in 1973.

In 1981, Landmark designation was approved by the City of Seattle for this structure.

Ordinance Number: 110352.

Today it is home to **Interfaith Community Church** (est. 1999), honoring all faith and spiritual traditions.

The historic building is a fine example of the small 19th and early 20th century community churches of the region.

Sanctuary

The Sanctuary of our historic building has seating capacity for 100.



Eight steps lead up to the main entrance on the north side of the building. There is a small uncovered porch at the top of the stairs and a small vestibule through the main door. Swinging doors separate the vestibule from the Sanctuary.



The main floor is filled with 18 lightly cushioned wooden pews. There are twelve tall windows on the east and west sides and two small windows on the north side.



There is a livingroom grand piano and an elegant lectern on the raised chancel. The altar is recessed in a small alcove. Nine oil lamps rest on a pedestal atop of the altar cabinet.



The Holy Books and significant scripture of diverse faith and spiritual traditions is housed within the altar cabinet.

A hand painted mandala hangs above the altar.

The acoustics are remarkable in this lovely sacred space and usually a sound system is not needed.

No food or drink permitted in our Sanctuary.

Rest rooms: One restroom is located on the upper floor. Two additional rest rooms are located in the downstairs Fellowship Hall.

Parking: the parking lot is accessed through the alley.

Additional Rooms

The **Consultation Room** is often used for the bride and bridesmaids, when the bridal party is small.

The **Lavender Room** is often used for the groom and groomsmen.

The **Fellowship Hall** downstairs is a respite area for arriving guests with access to water and restrooms.

Reception:

Our **Fellowship Hall** is a perfect location for a smaller reception with a kitchen adjacent to main room, and windows on three sides with access to parking lot and garden. Capacity: 100.

Wedding Rates:

Wedding Ceremony: \$1000.00
with Reception: \$1200.00.

Officiant / Celebrant, four set-up hours, four rehearsal hours and two take-down / clean-up hours included.

Deposit for Wedding:

A deposit of \$500.00 is required to reserve your date. \$1000.00 is due one month before wedding date.

Deposit for Reception:

Also a deposit of \$200.00 is required to reserve the Fellowship Hall for your reception.

Refund:

Your deposit/s will be refunded if space is restored to original condition.

Cleaning:

If additional cleaning is required following your event / ceremony your deposit will go toward this additional cleaning. If cleaning costs exceed the deposit amount, you will be billed for the additional cleaning costs.

Please Note:

All cleaning must be completed on the same day as your event / ceremony.
