JUDAISM:

According to Maimonides, four of the most important steps of teshuvah are the following:

Verbally confess your mistake and ask for forgiveness (Mishneh Torah 1:1).

Express sincere remorse, resolving not to make the same mistake again (Mishneh Torah 2:2).

Do everything in your power to "right the wrong," to appease the person who has been hurt (Mishneh Torah 2:9).

Act differently if the same situation happens again (Mishneh Torah 2:1). The fourth concept originates in the Talmud:

How is one to tell whether a penitent is genuine? Rabbi Judah said: When the penitent has the opportunity to commit the same sin once and once again and he refrains from committing it. - Yoma 86b -(https://www.sefaria.org/sheets/262459?lang=bi)

CHRISTIANITY:

Beware of false prophets, who come to you in sheep's clothing but inwardly are ravenous wolves. You will know them by their fruits. Are grapes gathered from thorns, or figs from thistles?
