Purifying the Body.

BUDDHISM:

It says the following in the Great Scripture on the Three Thousand Forms of Everyday Behavior for Monks, "Purifying the body refers to cleansing yourself of its excretions and keeping your nails clipped." Therefore, even though our bodies and minds are unstained, there is a method for cleansing the body, which is also a method for cleansing the mind. Not only will it purify body and mind, it will also purify those in our nation and those who train 'under a tree'. Even though no one in our nation has ever yet been sullied by the dust of existence, purifying is what all Buddhas keep in mind. Upon reaching the fruits of Buddhahood, They do not neglect or discontinue Their cleansing. The meaning of this is impossible to fully fathom. Proper decorum is one thing that is meant by it, and realizing the Way through ordination is one form of proper decorum.

A verse in the "Pure Deeds" chapter of the Avatamsaka Scripture says:

Whilst relieving nature, By all means pray that all sentient beings Will eliminate their impurities By completely ridding themselves of lust, anger, and delusion. Whilst washing up afterwards, By all means pray that all sentient beings May turn towards the Peerless Way And leave worldly things behind them. Whilst cleaning off the soil with water, By all means pray that all sentient beings Will avail themselves of purifying patience, That they may, after all, be free from any defilement.

TAOISM:

INDIGENOUS:

In making the central altar within the sweat lodge, where later the heated rocks will be placed, we first push a stick into the earth at the center of the lodge, and then around this point we draw a circle with a cord of rawhide. While fixing this holy center, we should pray.

"O Grandfather and Father Wakan-Tanka, maker of all that is, who always has been, behold me! And You, Grandmother and Mother Earth, You are wakan and have holy ears; hear me! We have come from You, we are a part of You, and we know that our bodies will return to You at that time when our

spirits travel along the great path. By fixing this center in the earth, I remember You to whom my body will return, but above all I think of *Wakan-Tanka*, with whom our spirits become as one. By purifying myself in this way, I wish to make myself worthy of You, O *Wakan-Tanka*, that my people may live!"

JUDAISM:

It is a clear and apparent matter that the concepts of purity and impurity are Scriptural decrees and they are not matters determined by a person's understanding and they are included in the category of *chukim* [commandments beyond reason]. Similarly, immersion in a mikveh [ritual bath] to ascend from impurity is included in the category of *chukim*, because impurity is not mud or filth that can be washed away with water. Instead, the immersion is a Scriptural decree and requires focusing the intent of one's heart. Therefore our Sages said: "When one immersed, but did not intend to purify himself," it is as if he did not immerse. Although it is a Scriptural decree, there is an allusion involved: One who focuses his heart on purifying himself becomes purified once he immerses, even though there was no change in his body. Similarly, one who focuses his heart on purifying his soul from the impurities of the soul, which are wicked thoughts and bad character traits, becomes purified when he resolves within his heart to distance himself from such counsel and immerse his soul in the waters of knowledge. And Ezekiel 36:25 states: "I will pour over you pure water and you will be purified from all your impurities and from all your false deities, I will purify you." -Maimonides, Mishneh Torah, Immersion Pools 11 (trans. Eliyahu Touger)

CHRISTIANITY:
